IN RE: VACATION OF STANDING ORDERS

ORDER

It has come to the Court's attention that several standing orders that are no longer used continue to be published as representing the procedures for practice in this Court. Further, in accordance with the recommendation of the United States Judicial Conference, this Court has incorporated any procedural requirement that establishes or affects substantive rules of practice applicable to litigants into its Uniform Local Rules. That being the case, the following standing orders should be vacated and should no longer have any force or effect:

Standing Order Implementing Temporary Amendments to Local Rules 7.1(D), 7.2(B) and 7.2(E), adopted on November 26, 2003.

Standing Order Regarding Social Security Cases, adopted on August 28, 1991.

Standing Local Order Regarding RICO Cases, adopted July 13, 1998.

Standing Order Regarding Disclosure of Recommendation and Diagnostic Information, adopted December 1, 1994.

Amended Standing Order Regarding Implementation of Sentencing Procedures under the Sentencing Reform Act of 1984, adopted December 1, 1994.


